



"A Letter from Pope Francis to His Jewish Brothers and Sisters in Israel" was written on February 2, 2024 to Dr. Karma Ben Johanan, who

teaches at the department of comparative religion at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. Dr. Ben Johanan was the coordinator of the open letter to the pope from more than 400 Jewish rabbis and scholars last November. In January, she wrote an article for America titled, "There is a right and wrong way for Catholics to criticize Israel." In his letter, Pope Francis invites everyone to work for peace in the Holy Land.
